#### **TOSCA**

#### Act II:

Tosca, a celebrated opera singer, is now under the control of Baron Scarpia, the chief of police, who is torturing her lover Mario Cavaradossi, so that Mario will reveal where Angelotti (his friend and an enemy of the State) is hiding. Tosca cannot stand listening to the torture anymore, and she reveals the hiding place. The suffering Mario is brought out to see her, when a servant of Scarpia reports that Napoleon (enemy of the State) has won the Battle of Marengo. Mario rejoices, and Scarpia says he will die. Mario is taken away. Scarpia reveals his desire to possess Tosca. Tosca agrees to submit on condition that Mario be freed. Scarpia pretends to agree to such terms, but he reveals (unknown to Tosca) that Mario will indeed be killed. When Scarpia claims her as his own, Tosca plunges a dagger into Scarpia's heart.
