

Mr. Green wishes to thank the Vestry, Father Herrick and all others who helped in mounting this production.

Act I. Violetta Valery a courtesan meets the young Alfredo who declares himself in love with her. She responds to him – the first time for her – then laughs it off with the brilliant "Sempre Libera".

Act II. Violetta and Alfredo are living deliriously happy in her new home. Alfredo rhapsodizes about his love for Violetta. Alfredo's father Germont, pays an unexpected visit and pleads for Violetta to leave his son because his daughter's marriage is in danger because of her relationship with Alfredo. She finally gives in. Germont consoles his son for his loss.

Act III. Violetta arrives on the arm of her protector Baron Douphol at a party given by Flora, her friend – only to find her former lover, Alfredo. He denounces her and throws his winnings in the game of cards at her feet. Germont arrives to console Violetta and order his son out.

Act IV. Violetta, dying of consumption in her run-down flat reads once again the letter from Germont saying that all has been explained to Alfredo and that both Alfredo and his father will be there soon. They are united a final time, but she falls on the floor in a consumptive fit saying that all will be well. Totally repentant, Alfredo falls on her dead body.

### WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

**GEORGIOS ARGERATOS** is a Greek tenor. After acquiring his BA in opera performance, he moved to NY to continue his operatic career. Georgios has performed in the NY area as a member of S.E. Program of Opera Manhattan and he also participates in various productions of the Regina Opera and Auore Opera. He also held many leading roles throughout his career: *Cavaradossi* in *Tosca, Nemorino* in *L'eliisir d'Amore, Faust* in *Faust, Rodolfo* in *La Boheme, Macbeath* in *The Beggors Opera*.

TAMARA CASHOUR is a collaborative pianist – music director – Soprano – award-winning composer and organist. She is currently Adjunct Professor of Instrumental Accompanying at William Paterson University for the Brass, Woodwinds & Strings Depts. In addition, she is a staff vocal accompanist at the Mannes College of Music. Ms. Cashour was a staff accompanist for the Manhattan School of Music from 1999-2007. Ms. Cashour made her Carnegie-Wild debut as a collaborative pianist in 2002. She has worked as a coach and/or musical director for U.S. Regional Opera & Music Theatre Companies including: Indianapolis Opera, Natchez Opera, Lake George Opera, the George St. Playhouse & South Orange Performing Arts Center. **BERNIE GENZER** is a retired NYC. High School of Speech Drama teacher after 30 years. He has a Bachelor's degree from Brooklyn College in Speech, and a Master of Fine Arts in Theatre from Boston University. Presently his other activities are designing the lighting for Lantern Theatre productions and teaching fencing for the Great Neck Arts Center. He also is involved in singing Barbershop Harmony as a Bass with the Long Island Harmonizers Chorus and his quartet All in A Chord. I would like to thank Bob Heim for steering him to this production, and my love, Beverly for encouragement and support. He has directed musical productions such as *The Pajama Game* and *Annie*, and acted in *Lovers & Other Strangers*, A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum, and Fools.

NATHANIEL GREEN is the Footlight Players' founder (1984) and artistic director. This ensemble has brought a large variety of fully staged theatrical productions to the community, including: The Marriage of Figaro, Rigoletto, Tosca, She Loves Me, The Glass Menagerie, The Price, Henry IV, and Othello just to name a few. He has also staged original works of his own, such as This Train of Life, The Enchanted Spring, Is the Glass Half Empty or Half Full?, Grampa Says Goodbye, and The Dancing Monk, and most recently, the successful Off-Off Broadway productions of Searching for Hamlet and Faust Meets Macbeth. He has also performed in opera, musical theatre and caberet. La Traviata is the 7th production by Nate that the Church of The Ascension has hosted; other performances have been: Hamlet, Our Town, The Importance of Being Earnest, Arsenic & Old Lace, Blithe Spirit, and The Tempest. Nate counts among his favorite Skakespearean roles: lago, Falstaff, Hamlet, and Prospero. He considers himself fortunate to have sufficient interests (art, literature, foreign languages, and travel) to ward off "the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune".

GINA HAVER has a background in theatre, oratorio, sacred music and opera. She's performed as a soloist at Avery Fisher Hall, Merkin Concert Hall, CAMI Hall, 92<sup>nd</sup> St. Y, Hecksher-State Park, Northport Theatre, Symphony Space St. Ann-Trinity Church, Brooklyn and Dicapo Opera Young Artist Program. She's performed as a soloist with NY Selan Ensemble, New York Chamber Players, the National Chorale Northport Opera, and NY Choral Society Summersings. Solo work includes: "Carmina Burana", "Israel Night in Egypt", Brahm's "Requiem", Mozarts's "Exsultate Jubilate" and opera roles such as: Queen of the Night in Magic Flute, Mimi and Musetta in La Boheme, Lola in Cavalleria Rusticana as well as Masterclass, Amadeus, Ladies in Retirement, Last of the Red Hot Lovers and What Remains. Gina is also a founding member of OperAlive, the newly formed opera ensemble performing throughout Long Island. She also sings regularly in Northport's Opera Night concert series. Gina is the Soprano soloist at the Church of The Ascension and cantor/pianist at St. Luke's RC Church.

STEPHANIE HOROWITZ is a Soprano whose recent NYC area operatic appearances include the title Rosalinde in Die Fledermaus (cover). Ms. Horowitz currently studies with Sherry Overholt in Manhattan, NY. In May of 2005 Ms. Horowitz received first place in the Five Towns Music and Arts Foundation's Young Artist Competition in the Musical Theatre Division. Favorite musical theatre roles include Frenchie in Cabaret, Emma Goldman/Housewife in Assassins, and Anita in West Side Story. She is also an avid lover of vocal jazz, singing for the Boop Troupe in Manhattan and the South Shore Syncopators on Long Island. A 2005 recipient of the Wayne Newton Music Scholarship, Ms. Horowitz is a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, MA where she received a Masters Degree in Vocal Performance. As a member of N.E.C.'s Opera Studio, Ms. Horowitz sang the role of Noemie in Massenet's Cendrillon.

**LYDIA PAULSEN** was born in Queens, NY. She has been a Rockville Centre resident and member of the church of the ascension since 1986. An art teacher for 35 years, she continues her craft by piecing together elaborate quilts, making delicious jams and building small houses out of gingerbread. In her spare time she enjoys traveling and has been to every continent except Antarctica.

**ALEXIS PESANTI** has received vocal performance degrees from Hartt School of Music and SUNY Purchase. She has performed in numerous operas including *Dialogue of the Carmelites, The Marriage of Figaro and Dido and Aeneus*. Recent performances include scenes at *Maones Extension division* and *Soprano Soks in Schobert's Mass in G*. Alexis currently lives and teaches voice on Long Island.

ROMAN SLADKOPEVETS is a tenor who graduated from the Yekaterinburg State Drama Institute in 1998 (Master of Music and Drama) During his studies at the institute, he worked as a solo vocalist at the Sverdlovsk Musical Comedy Theater. In 2003 he graduated from the Moscow State University of Culture and Arts (DMA in Vocal Pedagogy). Since 2003, he has been working as a teacher at the Solo Singing Chair. As an opera and chamber singer, Roman is engaged in intense concert activities performing on various concert stages of Moscow (Palace of Youth, Kremlin Palace, House of Architects, House of Writers, House of Composers, etc), and takes part in numerous concerts with such directors as N.N. Kalinin, B.S. Voron, V.V. Afanasyev, M. Kazhlayev, M.G. Bank, Ye.E. Graseyev. His repertoire features about many opera parts, including those of Lensky (Eugene Onegin by P. Tchaikovsky), Turiddu (Cavalleria Rusticana by P. Mascagni), Alfredo (La Traviata by G. Verdi), Rodolfo (La Boheme by G. Puccini), as well as many romances by Russian and international composers, Neapolitan and Russian folk songs. In 2003 Roman became a laureate of the Festos festival in the classical vocal nomination. As a teacher, he upgrades his skills participating in master classes held at the L.A. Gergieva Academy (Finland) and the Italo-American Academy (2004-2005). In 2007 he was awarded with the Charoite Star order (for young talented artists of Russia), and in 2008 received the Professional of Russia order. Roman is a partner of the Sozvezdiye charity foundation.

**LINDA TAGLIAFERRO** is a coloratura Soprano who has studied at the Juilliard Evening Division with Joyce McLean, and taken numerous opera workshops with Emily and Marian Thompson at Mannes College. She is a freelance writer and artist.
